For me it's love. My mother isn't a quilter—she can barely sew on a button. My aunt was too busy raising 5 children to quilt and my grandmother liked to create things with a little more “spirit” in the bathtub of her house.

When Brains was a baby I loved picking out the fabrics and tracing every template by hand and cutting each piece one by one. Sewing patchwork by machine was fine but machine quilting was taboo in the quilt world so I learned how to make tiny hand stitches and loved every minute of it.

acrylic rulers, computerized sewing machines, fabrics with funny names, like baticks and long arm quilting machines for the home. Terms like strip piecing, jelly rolls, assembly line sewing and fusible applique made me fall in love even more.

The romance of quilting days past tug at my heart sometimes as I remember working long into the night to create something special that someone would hold dear to their heart forever and ever.

I look forward to seeing what our speaker this month, Nancy Snyder of The Stitchery, will bring so my journey to create lasting memories will go even fastest.

I wonder what the quilting world will be like when Kay-Bug and Mac-A-Doodle start their journeys. Perhaps, I should start a box of my special fabric scrapes and gadgets for them to inherit one day.

I can picture it now as they pull out this dusty box and open the lid to

find a large yellow handled tool.

“Mom, what's this?” Kay-Bug says.

“Why honey,” Brains will say, “That was grandma's favorite rotary cutter. And she used it to make your very first quilt.”

“Doodle Quilts” Workshop

Nontraditional Whole Cloth Quilt Design

July 26, 2014

You will not need your machine today. We will be designing a whole cloth quilt top which can later be quilted by machine or by hand. Leave your stress at home, relax, these designs are free form and surprises happen. You can change your mind rework your design as you go, so no mistakes, only design opportunities. We will follow a sequence for designing your first quilt. You will quickly fine you own design ideas and move beyond your first doodle quilt.

Supply list:

3/4 yard of fabric in one of the following colors black, white, or cream fabric ready to be worked on. (Prewashed, if you like your fabric prewashed, and of course ironed.)

Marking tools, for black fabric I use chalk or white colored pencil, clover white marking pen, or white Fons and Porter; for white I use a blue water erasable pen. (Purple goes away too fast.)

Design books, or stencils, you like. **Be sure to label yours.**

Ordinary rulers, (French curves if you have them, I will have some that can be used at class.)

A card board gift box or two, with paper scissors.

A cutting mat (in case the tables are not smooth to draw on.)

Paper and pencil


Meetings are held on the 4th Thursday of the month, January through October. There is no meeting in November and the December meeting is a holiday dinner.
