President's Challenge

This year starts with me issuing a challenge to you. Put on your creative thinking caps and make a quilt that reflects the theme-"AIR". The rules are pretty simple and I hope will stretch your quilting imagination. Good luck to everyone.

THE RULES

THEME-"AIR"

It may be a traditional, modern or art quilt....anything goes and that fits the size requirements. Size requirements- no smaller than 12" x 12" and no larger than 30" x 30".

- The theme "AIR" can be reflected in the pattern (Mariners' compass to nine patch stars... it's all good), AND/OR fabrics used (Spaceships, flowers, flying bugs, birds, nothing but blue fabric? Christmas wall hangings with the night sky and the guiding star? A baby quilt with some star fabric?) It's all okay.
- The smallest quilt you can enter is 12" x 12" but it's doesn't have to be square. Let your imagination and creativity run free!
- The challenge starts as soon as you read this notice and ends at the May salad supper at which time we will display and vote on , "Most Creative", "Best Interpretation of the Theme", "Best Use of Color", and "My Favorite for no Particular Reason".

Hand Quilting Workshop

What is old is new again. With hand embroidery trending right now there is renewed interest in hand quilting, but a more relaxed approach. If you have never hand-quilted before or would like to start again join us as we explore the basic techniques. We'll learn the quilters knot, all about needles and thimbles, batting choices for hand quilting, basic marking, loading our frames, along with the actual stitch. We will also explore what different threads are being used and what actual hand stitching can do to change the whole flavor of your quilt. This is a technique workshop so be prepared to play explore the infinite possibilities of hand quilting.

Supply List for Hand Quilting Workshop

- 2- 24" pieces of solid color quilting fabric in white, cream or very light pastel
- \Diamond I-24" square of batting (low loft polyester, cotton, or 80/20 is fine)
- Quilting hoop and stand (if you have one)
- ♦ Thimble(s) of your choice that fit your finger
- Quilting needles (several sizes if you have them or if you have no quilting needles bring regular sewing needles)
- Needle threader
- ♦ Scissors
- \diamond A spool of regular sewing thread that will contrast with your fabric
- ♦ A ruler
- ♦ A marking pen or pencil for fabric
- ◊ I-2 Band-Aids
- Beeswax or thread conditioner if you have it

1st Annual Generosity Fun Day

April 23 7PM: Generosity Meeting and Make and Take Silk Scarf (order and pay for scarf by March 26th)

Nancy Ondera and Ione Martin have been planning for April Generosity meeting where we will be cutting batting and fabric for lap robes and sewing and kitting wheel chair pockets and quilts. We will be working on pillowcases where you can pick what you would like to do either matching fabrics or cutting the pieces or pinning the burrito or sewing or turning and ironing and sewing some more.

We decided we need a day of doing the same things mentioned before we even have our meeting to organize all the fabric. Nancy has lots of flannel that we thought we could cut and sew two pieces together and bind. They would be good soft receiving blankets. We can back the lap robes with flannel and use for the backs in the quilt kits. The flannel didn't work so well for the pillowcases. Any other ideas for the flannel?

Nancy Baker has many kits for Wheel Chair pockets. Nancy Ondera has much more Home Décor fabric we thought could be made into tote bags and donated to bags4kids or an organization like them that donate bags to Foster Kids organizations so they have bags to transport their personal items from one home to another. The tote bags would also work well to donate to Safe Passage and Pay It Forward House. Many times the pillowcases are used as tote bags. Does anyone have strapping that we could use for handles? Otherwise we can make straps.

A quote from Nancy Ondera:

"This GP fabric is not meant to sit around--it's supposed to be out working in the world, doing good for folks, from our preemies on up! :)"

This fabric does need to get out into the world and out of Nancy Ondera's basement. This is a fun day a great way to meet other guild members and do what we love to do sew especially with no cost to us since Nancy has all this fabric.

New Guild Workshop

Finishing School

Finishing School is something new. Finishing school is for anyone that has gone to a paid workshop since June of 2014 and would like to finish up. So if you never sewed the Color Wash project that we brought home just pinned on a foundation piece bring it on by with your machine. If you started a Doodle Quilt and want to continue with your Doodle's come on to Finishing School. If you were practicing Free Motion with Frieda and want to practice some more or if you have an item (like the Doodle Quilt or the Color Wash Mini) to use your skills come to Finishing School. I know at November's workshop Gifts To Make we went home with many items finished but if you want to make some more come to Finishing School. I got the idea when a few of us talked of finishing our Rock Star Bags. Just two of us got together and finished a bag and started another. If you want to make another Rock Star Bag come to Finishing School. If you want to practice your Hand Quilting stay for the afternoon. If you have signed up for the Mini Quilt in March plan to stay in the afternoon, bring a lunch and join our second finishing school.

Pillow Cases

The guild began making pillowcases in 2011. It began when members found themselves with yards and yards of fabric and the idea of making simple "hot dog" style pillowcases. Members started donating fabrics, mostly juvenile, but found adults also needed pillow cases! Members make up kits of coordinating fabrics. These kits are available at most meetings for members to take home to stitch together and return.

Our first donation was 80 pillowcases for a group of underprivileged kids called Sandy's Kids. We sorted through all the cases and matched them to the age and gender of the children. Then each child was invited to choose the one they liked. They loved them so much that we were asked again this fall to donate more.

80 pillowcases were donated to Washington tornado victims. 10 pillowcases were given to a family that had been in a car accident. We donate to the Pay It Forward House in Sycamore. They have used them in their raffle baskets and on their beds. The staff noted the pillowcases have been disappearing, apparently they make good tote bags as well as pillowcases!

This is a great stash buster project. It is the size of project that members will take home and bring back in a timely manner. And sometimes it is just what you need to get sewing again.
