ROCKSTAR BAG

Some information about Sara:

Sara Lawson is a bag pattern designer and fabric designer from Chicago, Illinois. She has two fabric lines with Art Gallery Fabrics called 'Jungle Ave.' and 'Fantasia'. She is the author of 'Big-City Bags' and 'Windy City Bags' (the latter due out October 2015), in addition to curated collections with Aurifil threads. Her sewing pattern company is self-published under her brand, Sew Sweetness. You can find more on-line at www.sewsweetness.com.

Workshop Saturday, January 24, 2015

This medium-sized bag is full of great detailing. It has a top zipper closure and both a short handle and a long cross-body strap. With an outer flap pocket and two inner zippered pockets, you will have plenty of storage space to keep all of your essentials. Although the piping is optional, it definitely gives things an extra kick! The bag has an edgy zipper on the outer flap, and you can make it rockstar-worthy with some optional rivets.

The pdf pattern includes 23 pages of sewing instructions, complete with 55 step-by-step color photos. **Finished Size:** 9-1/2" long x 10" tall x 7" deep.

President's Challenge 2015

This year starts with me issuing a challenge to you. Put on your creative thinking caps and make a quilt that reflects the theme-"AIR". The rules are pretty simple and I hope will stretch your quilting imagination. Good luck to everyone.

THE RULES

THEME-"AIR"

It may be a traditional, modern or art quilt....anything goes and that fits the size requirements.

Size requirements- no smaller than 12" x 12" and no larger than 30" x 30".

The theme "AIR" can be reflected in the pattern (Mariners' compass to nine patch stars... it's all good), AND/OR fabrics used (Spaceships, flowers, flying bugs, birds, nothing but blue fabric? Christmas wall hangings with the night sky and the guiding star? A baby quilt with some star fabric?) It's all okay.

The smallest quilt you can enter is 12" x 12" but it's doesn't have to be square. Let your imagination and creativity run free!

The challenge starts as soon as you read this notice and ends at the May salad supper at which time we will display and vote on , "Most Creative", "Best Interpretation of the Theme", "Best Use of Color",and "My Favorite for no Particular Reason".

Supply List



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The pdf pattern includes 23 pages of sewing instructions, complete with 55 step-by-step color photos.

Finished Size: 9-1/2" long x 10" tall x 7" deep

Supplies

- ◆ 3/4 yard of Exterior Fabric
- ◆ 3/4 yard of solid fabric for the straps/piping (piping is optional, but solid fabric is still needed for straps)
- ◆ 1 yard of Lining Fabric
- ◆ 3 yards of 20" wide Pellon SF-101 Shape Flex fusible woven interfacing (or light-weight fusible interfacing)
- ◆ 1/2 yard of By Annie's Soft and Stable, available at local quilt shops or on-line (Soft and Stable is a 1/8" thick, foam sew-in interfacing; one of my testers also recommends automotive headliner fabric in place of the Soft and Stable; you can also substitute a needled fleece fusible interfacing for the Soft and Stable, such as Pellon #TP971F Thermolam Plus fusible interfacing)

Optional:

- ◆ 11" x 4-3/4" piece of Pellon #70 Peltex sew-in extra-firm interfacing (for a firm bottom)

Optional:

- ◆ 2 yards of 5/32" cotton cording (cut in half for two 1-yard pieces for piping)
- ◆ Two metal swivel clips (with opening of 3/4" or 1" wide)
- ◆ Four d-rings (with opening of 1-1/4" wide)
- ◆ Two d-rings (with opening of 3/4" or 1" wide)
- ◆ 1/2" magnetic snap
- ◆ 11" or 12" regular zipper
- ◆ Two 9" regular zippers
- ◆ 7" regular zipper

Optional:

- ◆ 4 metal purse feet

Optional:

- ◆ metal rivets with press (I used 8mm double cap rivets and press from MinkusMargo on Etsy)



Where: Stronghold Camp & Retreat Center, Oregon, IL; 1922 Illinois 2, Oregon, IL 61061
Heritage Lodge (That's the nice, new one!).

When: Thursday, April 16–Sunday, April 19, 2015.

Why: Because it's fun, you'll get a bunch of quilting done, and it doesn't cost a ton!

What's Included: 2 or 3 nights' accommodations and meals (Supper: night of arrival; Breakfast: day of departure; Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner all days in between)
(some rooms are handicapped accessible)

We are trying something new this year. The standard package is Thursday evening to Sunday noon (3 Night Program), but we realize that some people have to work. So you can also book an abbreviated package featuring Friday evening arrival with departure Sunday noon (2 Night Program). Rates depend on the number of people in your room (Yes, we will try to line up a roommate for you at your request, but no promises!)

Hand Quilting Workshop

What is old is new again. With hand embroidery trending right now there is renewed interest in hand quilting, but a more relaxed approach. If you have never hand-quilted before or would like to start again join us as we explore the basic techniques. We'll learn the quilters knot, all about needles and thimbles, batting choices for hand quilting, basic marking, loading our frames, along with the actual stitch. We will also explore what different threads are being used and what actual hand stitching can do to change the whole flavor of your quilt. This is a technique workshop so be prepared to play explore the infinite possibilities of hand quilting.

Supply List for Hand Quilting Workshop

- ◇ 2- 24” pieces of solid color quilting fabric in white, cream or very light pastel
- ◇ 1-24” square of batting (low loft polyester, cotton, or 80/20 is fine)
- ◇ Quilting hoop and stand (if you have one)
- ◇ Thimble(s) of your choice that fits your finger
- ◇ Quilting needles (several sizes if you have them or if you have no quilting needles bring regular sewing needles)
- ◇ Needle threader
- ◇ Scissors
- ◇ A spool of regular sewing thread that will contrast with your fabric
- ◇ A ruler
- ◇ A marking pen or pencil for fabric
- ◇ 1-2 Band-Aids
- ◇ Beeswax or thread conditioner if you have it
