## “GENEROSITY PROJECT”

7:00pm

This meeting marks the eleventh anniversary of the debut of “The Generosity Project”, our concept for supporting charitable activities in our community and beyond. It began with a donation of more than 1,000 yards of cottons, mostly juvenile prints and old-fashioned calicoes, from an anonymous donor in Michigan whom we called simply “our benefactress”. We created a “Generosity Project Stash” of crib-quilt kits, complete with easy patterns, which are available to members to check out at meetings.

Since 2003, we have accepted several other sizeable donations, as well as many smaller gifts from both guild members and community residents. A recent order by Sally Davis for her shop that wasn't what she had in mind has resulted in her generous offer to bring nearly 50 yards into the GP Stash to use for backing.

To date, DCQG has donated well over 1,300 baby and child-sized quilts since 2003. What a great tribute to the spirit of loving-kindness that inspires quilters to use their creative talents to benefit others!

The April meeting will offer both machine-sewing and cutting activities, as well as kit-making and GP quilt kit sign-out. Here's a preview of our get-together and what to bring:

\*Pillowcase sewing – sewing machine/neutral thread, any solid fabrics in quarter-yard widths for the accent strip in the pillowcase pattern

\*Generosity Project kit sign-out

\*Cat pillow sewing – sewing machine/neutral thread, any heavy-duty fabric in half-yard lengths and/or any fabric trimmings for the stuffing

\*Amnesty Night to return GP kits or HOTB block kits you haven't completed

\*Batting cutting – bring your shears

\*Backing cutting – bring your shears (this is the fabric Sally Davis is donating)

\*A raffle for those who sign out GP kits, turn in finished baby quilts, or return unfinished kits

\*Prizes!!

\*Show 'n Tell—**but at 8:30 p.m.**, so we can jump right into our projects

Come for a fun and productive night to hang out with your Fabric Friends, and be prepared to dive in as soon as you get there—the two hours of a “working meeting” always speed by!

### **Here's what we need from YOU:**

- **Silent Auction Pieces:** Quilted items that are no larger than (30" X 30"). Can be wall hangings, table runners, household items, etc. Bring them in anytime and give to Cheri Stack, Sue Kapperman, or Rita Mitchell
- **DCQG Boutique Items:** By now most of us are going thru those stacks of books and magazines that have been collecting dust and are looking for that perfect quilt for the quilt show. We all want to earn one of those wonderful ribbons don't we? Well, as you are looking thru the books and magazines, set aside those that you don't think that you will ever look at again. I will be collecting them for the boutique. Also search that stash you have and when you run across that fabric you just had to have and now wonder why – set that aside also. All of your unwanted fabric, magazine and books can be sold at the boutique. All proceeds from the sale of these items will go into the Guild treasury to help pay for the programs for the next 2 years. Also while you are creating that terrific quilt and the minis, remember to toss scraps into small bags for the boutique. I'll let you know when I will start to collect all your donations. If you would like to make items to sell in the boutique, I will have a supply of tags at the meetings. We use a 2 part tag – every item you make must have a tag. Remember that 10% of sales from handmade items go to the guild. It is a great way to earn a little extra cash to help support your quilting habit. Annie Berg

## 2014 Programs:

**June 26, 2014 Guild Meeting—7:00pm,  
“Exuberant Color”**  
Wanda S. Hanson



Wanda S. Hanson started quilting in 1957 when she was a teenager. This ended up being a career, making quilts, teaching quilt making for over 30 years, and giving programs for guilds and other organizations. Several of her quilts have been published in books, calendars, and magazines. She also owned a quilt shop in the 1980s and was the fabric buyer for two other shops.

The joy of working with color, a good sense of mathematics, and loving the hum of the sewing machine are some of things that got her started. Even though she did extensive hand embroidery of all kinds, she has always machine quilted her quilts. The past 20 years have been devoted more to art quilting for the wall and less to functional bed quilts. When working on a series, couch quilt size has been an alternate choice. She creates not to communicate deep inner thought, but to celebrate color, pattern, texture and the joy that it brings her. Her work is set apart by her incredible use of color, precision in piecing, and textural quilting.

**Saturday, June 28, 2014—Workshop, “Intuitive Color”, 10:00am – 1:00pm,**


Enjoy the relaxation of using color intuitively instead of with rules and memorized terms. With a pack of 100 – 2 1/2” squares of fabric (included in workshop fee) do exercises with color and value, contrast and blend while viewing quilts representing each of those things. Bring a camera to record each of your exercises since we dismantle each of them as we go on to the next one.

Supply list: 27” square of plain color fabric to build the last exercise on. Flannel works great but regular fabric is OK. No printed fabric please. 27” is 3/4 yard and you can just fold it into the 27” square. Pins if you want to pin the pieces to the background to take home or binder clips if you want to stack the rows of squares for transport.

Optional – if you already have these items, bring them. It is not necessary to go out and purchase them.

**Entry Rules and Information:**

- **For EACH entry**
  - Complete **ONE** application for **EACH** entry including signature. **Please tell us about your quilt/entry.** What would you like the viewers to know? Did you have an inspiration? Is this your first quilt? Please use the "Quilt Story" area on the application to share about your quilt/entry. If you need more room you may use the back of the form or type your story on a separate sheet of paper.
  - Attach a good quality **4" X 6" photo** of the quilt showing color and pattern of the quilt.
  - For each **JUDGED** item include a \$5 application fee. (Make checks payable to DCQG.) Display only entries are free.
- **Include an SASE.** Only one SASE is needed per person/address (not one per entry).

- All applications must be postmarked by August 30, 2014.
- Confirmation letters will be sent no later than September 20, 2014 with instructions about quilt drop-off and pick-up.
- **All "Bed Sized" and "Wall Hanging" quilts are required to have a rod pocket for hanging.** The pockets **MUST** be 4" deep and the width of the quilt. **If the quilt is longer than 90", please place the hanging sleeve 90" from the bottom.**
- All entries must be labeled with the owner's name and phone number on the back in the lower left corner (when facing the quilt). When dropping off the quilt, please fold the quilt so that this label is on the outside on top.
- Harvest of Quilts is a juried show and the quilts chosen represent the decision of the show committee.
- DCQG reserves the right to change the category of a quilt and not to give awards in categories where the judge does not see "winning" quality.
