I became a quilter in 2004 by accident. I had recently retired from a career in manufacturing and was living in a new house. One long, blank wall in the stairwell was crying out for some color so I set out to find a piece of fabric (kind of like Marimekko but been there, done that). What I found instead was Pamela Mostek’s “Just Can’t Cut It” book with simple quilt patterns. I adapted one of her patterns to fit my space and was instantly hooked on working with fabric and creating my own designs.

I describe my style as contemporary but it really is all over the map. My designs are all original and I find inspiration all over. Most of my quilts have begun with a title and then I just have to figure out how to translate my verbal ideas into visual ones.

My quilts have been accepted to, and win awards at, Paducah, Quilt Expo, Houston and Road to California. My most fun entries have been to the National Quilt Museum’s “New Quilts from an Old Favorite” contest which I have won twice.
